Hicks Plastics, an IATF 16949:2016 Registered company, founded by Carl Hicks in 1988 with one molding machine, has grown exponentially by adding 24 injection molding machines and more production space. Over the years, Hicks Plastics has earned a reputation for quality through hard work, attention to detail and timely delivery of quality products. The summer of 2000 proved to be another steppingstone in the growth of Hicks Plastics through the purchase of the first 2 vacuum metallizers, now totaling 5. Additionally, in 2008 Hicks Plastics purchased their 24th and largest, injection molding machine, a 1500 ton Van Dorn.

Our long-term goal is to continually try to grow our molding, and metalizing business, which is mainly focused on lighting components. We currently mold from 75 tons up to 1500 tons, spray thermal and UV cure basecoat and topcoat. Additionally, we Vacuum Metalize using aluminum within chamber top-coat, stainless steel, and chromium. Most of our metalizing business is direct metalizing which has allowed us to remove the base coat on several programs, giving our customers very attractive pricing compared to our competition.
