

# Service Area



#### Youth HOPE

- Youth development program to increase knowledge and awareness regarding opioid use disorder
- Served 166 5th graders in Union County
- 20 hours of programming across the school year.
- Outcome: Promotion of youth development through school-based programs created an opportunity to enhance OUD prevention in rural communities











### **Hispanic Outreach**

- Collaboration with prominent & influential Centro Hispano Hispanic-serving organization in East TN.
- Centro Hispano identified community need for substance use disorder (SUD) education, including youth prevention strategies.
- Worked with around 30 parents and 20 adolescents
- Outcome: Parent/adolescent access to Spanish language materials and gained knowledge on accessing resources for substance use.

#### **Student Health Council**

- Empower Students to become active in creating a Healthy and Drug-Free School environment.
- 12 Student Members
- Co-led by ICARE Director & Union County health educator
- 2 Teacher Sponsors
- Meet bi-weekly
- Students implemented school-wide campaigns, created and distributed educational material, and advocated for policies that support a healthy school environment.



#### **Teacher In-Service**

- At each teacher in-service, two topics are provided concurrently, and the 1-hour sessions are conducted multiple times to accommodate the rotation of teachers from Union County public schools.
- Topics Included:
  - SUD 101: SUD and the brain
  - Skills to Deal
  - Cool, Calm, & Collected: Empowering Teacher of Youth, Ages 10-14
  - Mental Health & Learning: Mind-Body Skills for Emotional Regulation







## **Caregiver Workshop**

- The caregiver workshops are recorded and shared on Facebook to address barriers to participation. The recent mental health and learning workshop was also streamed live on FB.
- Topics included:
  - Substance Use & the Adolescent Brain
  - Cool, Calm, & Collected
  - Mental Health & Learning

# FLOC: FAITH LEADERS OVERCOMING OPIOIDS

- Goal: Enhance and expand OUD treatment and recovery services by promoting integrated, interdisciplinary care and reducing stigma amongst faith-based leaders.
- 4-month mentoring program
- 20 faith-based leaders from Cocke, Claiborne, Union, Sevier, and Jefferson counties participated in the FLOC program (5 cohorts).

- 82 people tested for HIV and HCV


